There are a lot of fun things to see and hear at the ballet, including dancers in costumes and beautiful scenery, and classical music.




Watching a ballet is similar to watching a movie, because it tells a story.

This is what the front of the Belk Theater looks like.




Everyone needs a ticket to enter. I may have to wait in line to get my ticket scanned by an usher.

After I go through the lobby, an usher will help me find my seat in the theater.




The theater is big. It has over 2,000 seats! I will see a stage with a curtain, lights, and speakers. I may be sitting next to someone I do not know.

Nutcracker is a classic holiday story about a girl name Clara, and her Nutcracker.




I will see dancers dressed like kids, adults, animals, dolls, snowflakes and more!

During intermission we hope you go visit our Sensory performance partner tables to learn about their services and pick up some information. These are just some of the partners you will see below.










When they flash the lights, that means I should find my seat and get ready for Act 2.
