# Act I

Prince Siegfried and his friends are celebrating his 21<sup>st</sup> birthday in the palace gardens when his mother, the Queen, arrives to present her son with a crossbow as a gift. The Queen reminds Siegfried of his duty to choose a bride and marry, but he replies that there is no one with whom he is in love. The Prince's mother and friends leave him in a melancholy mood. He is heartened when a flock of swans fly overhead, and he chases.

### Act II

Siegfried is hunting in the forest when he encounters Von Rothbart, an evil sorcerer who is the ruler of this enchanted place. Frightened, Siegfried prepares to shoot when Odette, Queen of the Swans, arrives in time to come between him and Von Rothbart. Odette explains how Von Rothbart has transformed her and her friends into swans, except between the hours of midnight and dawn when they resume their human forms. The only way to break this evil spell is if a man promises to marry her and never love another. Siegfried swears his faithfulness. After affirming their love, Odette and Siegfried are interrupted by Von Rothbart. It is dawn and Odette, and her friends fall under the spell of the wicked sorcerer, leaving Siegfried alone in the forest.

# **INTERMISSION**

### Act III

The Queen has arranged a ball in honor of her son in the hopes that he will choose a bride from among the royal guests. After dancing with several prospective brides, Siegfried tells his mother he will not marry any of them since he loves only Odette. Von Rothbart arrives with his daughter, Odile, whom he has transformed into the likeness of Odette. Rothbart hopes to trick Siegfried into promising to marry Odile, thereby keeping his spell on Odette unbroken. The guests from foreign lands dance a Spanish dance, a Hungarian czardas, a lively Neapolitan dance and a Polish mazurka. While dancing with Odile, Siegfried is enchanted by Von Rothbart's creation. As Siegfried swears eternal love to Odile, a vision of Odette appears, but it is too late. The Prince's oath is Von Rothbart's triumph, and the scene ends with Siegfried tormented by the agony of guilt.

# Act IV

In despair, Odette arrives at the lakeside to tell her friends of Siegfried's betrayal. Siegfried finds Odette among the swans and begs her forgiveness. Although Odette forgives Siegfried, she realizes that their love is doomed. Von Rothbart gathers a storm in hopes to separate the lovers, but Odette breaks away to leap into Siegfried's arms for one last embrace. Torn between her love for Siegfried and the power of Von Rothbart, Odette ultimately succumbs to the powers of evil. Faced with the reality that Odette will forever remain a swan, Siegfried collapses, brokenhearted.

# **LEADERSHIP**



# Alejandro Cerrudo / Artistic Director

Alejandro Cerrudo was born in Madrid, Spain. His professional career includes work with Victor Ullate Ballet, Stuttgart Ballet, Nederlands Dans Theater 2 and Hubbard Street Dance Chicago (HSDC). Cerrudo became HSDC's first-ever resident choreographer in 2008 and held that position until 2018.

Cerrudo's body of work has been performed by over 20 professional dance companies around the world. Honors include an award from the Boomerang Fund for Artists

(2011) and the Prince Prize for Commissioning Original Work from the Prince Charitable Trusts (2012) for his acclaimed, first evening-length work, "One Thousand Pieces." In 2014 he was awarded the USA Donnelley Fellowship by United States Artists. Also, Cerrudo was one of four choreographers invited by New York City Ballet's Wendy Whelan to create and perform original duets for "Restless Creatures." In 2017 Cerrudo was invited by Daniil Simkin to choreograph a site-specific performance for the Guggenheim Rotunda, a Works & Process Rotunda Project commission, featuring Daniil Simkin and original costumes by Dior. Cerrudo's "Sleeping Beauty," created with Ballet Theater Basel in 2016, was nominated as "Production of the Year" in Switzerland in the "Tanz, Jahrbuch 2016" by the Neue Zürcher Zeitung.

In 2020 Cerrudo was appointed Pacific Northwest Ballet's first-ever resident choreographer. Independently, he directed and choreographed his show, "It Starts Now," which premiered 2020 at The Joyce Theater in New York. In 2022, Cerrudo was appointed Artistic Director of Charlotte Ballet.



# **Douglas Singleton /** Executive Director

Doug Singleton's passion for dance began at Spoleto Festival USA with a performance of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater. After graduating from the College of Charleston, he moved to New York City and spent over five years traveling with the Ailey company. While in New York, he was the producing manager for the premiere performances of Complexions Contemporary Ballet, led by Dwight Rhoden and Desmond Richardson, and worked with dance luminaries such as Judith Jamison,

Masazumi Chaya, Jerome Robbins, Garth Fagan, Elisa Monte and Lar Lubovitch.

Doug joined Charlotte Ballet in 1996. Now in his 17th year as the company's Executive Director, Doug has led Charlotte Ballet through a period of transformational growth and international attention. During his tenure, he has partnered with many community leaders to establish the Reach Program, allowing every child the opportunity to train for dance as a career. He also successfully completed multiple campaigns to enhance the brand and repertoire as well as established a permanent home at the Patricia McBride & Jean-Pierre Bonnefoux Center for Dance in the heart of Charlotte's vibrant Uptown. During this period, Charlotte Ballet made its first-ever appearances at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC and the Joyce Theater in Manhattan with long awaited returns to American Dance Festival as well as Jacob's Pillow under the artistic leadership of Hope Muir.



# **Yarina Conners** / Director of Artistic Operations

Yarina Conners began her non-profit arts management career at The Cleveland Orchestra in 2008, managing all operations of three youth choruses, in addition to working with the renowned Cleveland Orchestra Chorus. From 2010-2016, Yarina worked as Senior Operations Manager at Classical Movements, a premiere concert touring company located in historic Old Town Alexandria in Virginia. While at Classical Movements, Yarina arranged orchestral tours for The Minnesota Orchestra, Cincinnati

Symphony Orchestra, and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra. She also arranged international and national tours for choral ensembles and produced an international choral festival in Washington, DC. Joining the artistic planning team at The Clarice Smith Performing Arts Center at the University of Maryland in 2016, Yarina served as Artistic Administrator for the programming department. Focusing specifically on the operational and administrative aspects of the presenting program, Yarina played a key role as the liaison for the artistic planning team with the various departments of The Clarice. In January 2022, Yarina joined the Charlotte Ballet as Director of Artistic Operations. Yarina emigrated from Moscow, Russia in 1994 to Cleveland, Ohio and earned her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music in 2008. After spending ten years in the Washington, DC area from 2010-2020, her family relocated to Charlotte in December 2020. Yarina currently resides in South Charlotte with her family.

# **Ana Lopez** / Rehearsal Director

Ana Lopez began her formal training at Conservatorio de Danza Diputacion de A Coruña. Upon graduating Isaac Diaz Pardo High School, she continued her training at Centro Internacional de Danza Carmen Roche. Lopez danced with Joven Ballet Carmen Roche, with Compañia Nacional de Danza 2 in works by Nacho Duato and Tony Fabre, and Ballet Theater Munich under the directorship of Philip Taylor.

From 2008 to 2019 she danced with Hubbard Street Dance Chicago where she performed works by choreographers such as Jiri Kylian, Mats Ek, Ohad Naharin, Crystal Pite, William Forsythe, Jorma Elo, Alejandro Cerrudo, and many others. She was named one of Dance Magazine's "25 to Watch" in 2012, and in 2017, she was invited to perform in Daniil Simkin's "Falls the Shadow", a site-sepcific work choreographed for the Guggenheim Rotunda and commisioned by Work & Process. She has been acting as Assistant to the Choreographer and Stager for Alejandro Cerrudo for over a decade, setting his works in companies all over the world. In 2022, she helped stage several works at Charlotte Ballet and is excited to work with the dancers and the rest of the organization further.

# Alicia Delgadillo / Rehearsal Director

Alicia Delgadillo began her career with Hubbard Street 2 and Hubbard Street Dance Chicago. She was a founding member of PARA.MAR Dance Theatre in 2020 and later joined Gibney Company as an Artistic Associate from 2021-2023. Delgadillo has collaborated with a wide array of choreographers and institutions, including Crystal Pite, Ohad Naharin, Alejandro Cerrudo, The Art Institute of Chicago, and The Second City.

She graduated with Honors from the Ailey/Fordham BFA Program where she was able to foster her passion for arts outreach through JUNTOS Collective, a non-profit dance outreach organization. She has taught through residencies with NYU Tisch School of Dance and Bard College, and also served as Artistic Coordinator for Hubbard Street Summer Intensive, Company Manager and Guest Rehearsal Director for PARA.MAR Dance Theatre, and has produced various artistic projects.



# CHOREOGRAPHER AND ARTISTIC CONTRIBUTORS



# **Ib Andersen /** Choreographer

Ib Andersen Ib Andersen's career performing on the world's greatest ballet stages led him to become the Artistic Director of Ballet Arizona and The School of Ballet Arizona in 2000. Born in Copenhagen, he began his journey in ballet at the Royal Danish Ballet, where he rose to become its youngest principal dancer at age 20. Joining New York City Ballet in 1980, Andersen became popular for his mastery of Balanchine's style, leading to principal roles in several notable ballets. His choreographic talent emerged in 1987 with

"1-2-3—1-2" for the Royal Danish Ballet, foreshadowing a prolific career beyond the stage. Transitioning from NYCB to Ballet Arizona, Andersen's direction infused the company with a blend of classical and contemporary repertoire, earning national recognition for groundbreaking works like "Diversions" and "Topia." His 2012 premiere of "Cinderella" and subsequent New York debut at the Joyce Theatre showcased Andersen's choreographic prowess, applauded by esteemed publications like The New York Times. Under Andersen's leadership, Ballet Arizona thrived, culminating in the 2016 presentation of "Round" at the Desert Botanical Garden, which drew praise from critics like Alastair Macaulay, who proclaimed in his review that Ballet Arizona is '...one of the most enterprising companies anywhere,' affirming the company's status as a beacon of innovation.



# María Simonetti / Repetiteur

A native of Buenos Aires, Ms. Simonetti trained as a dancer at Teatro Colón and danced with La Joven Guardia of Ballet Nacional de Cuba before becoming assistant to Laura Alonso and regisseur (stage director) for Cuballet. She was on the faculties of the Magda Aunon School of Ballet, Pittsburgh's Point Park College, and the Baltimore School for the Arts before becoming Ballet Mistress for the esteemed Hubbard Street Dance Chicago in 1995. As assistant to choreographer Daniel Ezralow, she helped create the multi-

media production Mandala for a South American tour; Torino Notte di Stelle, an arts special for Italian national television (RAI Uno); choreography for Pope John Paul II's celebration of International Youth Day; and Aeros, an innovative showcase for the Romanian National Gymnastics Team. On her own, Simonetti staged Lady Lost Found for the Bratislava Dance Theatre in Slovakia and the pas de six from Bournonville's *Napoli* for the National Ballet of Greece. She became Rehearsal Director for Ballet Arizona in 1997, but continues her active career as a visiting artist. She returns to Hubbard Street Dance Chicago every summer as a guest teacher, and was engaged in 2006 in a similar role by Montreal's Les Grands Ballets Canadiens. In the 2014-2015 season, Simonetti and Ib Andersen staged Andersen's acclaimed production of *Romeo & Juliet* with Kansas City Ballet as the finale of that company's 50th-anniversary season. Most recently Simonetti was a guest teacher for Nederlands Dans Theater.



# Michael Korsch / Lighting Designer

Michael Korsch is a lighting, projection and scenic designer based in Philadelphia, PA, where he earned his BA in theatre from Temple University. He has worked with numerous directors and choreographers, creating hundreds of visual designs for dance, theatre and other live performances throughout North and South America, Europe, Asia, and Australia, as well as New Zealand. Michael has been the resident lighting designer for Complexions Contemporary Ballet since 1998, and Ballet Arizona since 2001. In addition,

Michael has created designs for Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, American Ballet Theatre, Aspen Santa Fe Ballet, Backhausdance, BalletMet, Ballet Nice Méditerranée, Ballet West, BalletX, Carolina Ballet, Charlotte Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, Cleveland Play House, Czech National Ballet, DanceBrazil, Dance Theatre of Harlem, Dayton Contemporary Dance Company, Disney Creative Entertainment, English National Ballet, FELA! The Concert, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, MOMIX, Oakland Ballet, Philadelphia Ballet, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, Royal Danish Ballet, Sacramento Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, Staatsballett Berlin, and Washington Ballet among others.



# **Gavriel Heine /** Conductor

U.S.-born Gavriel Heine is one of the most sought-after conductors of ballet today. A graduate of the Moscow Conservatory, he was a resident conductor of the Mariinsky Theatre for 15 years, where he led over 850 performances (both in St. Petersburg and on 14 international tours) before resigning in April 2022 in protest over the war in Ukraine. While at the Mariinsky, classics such as Swan Lake, Sleeping Beauty, The Nutcracker, Paquita, Raymonda, La Bayadére, Cinderella, and Romeo and Juliet ran exclusively under his

direction. He has been Music Director of Northern Lights Festival Opera in Minnesota since 2011.

Heine has guest conducted for Opéra de Paris Ballet (*Don Quixote*), the Royal Ballet (*Swan Lake*), New York City Ballet (*Nutcracker*), Boston Ballet (*Romeo and Juliet*), Béjart Ballet (*Firebird, Bolero*), State Ballet of Georgia (*Romeo and Juliet*, *Serenade, Concerto Barocco, Mozartiana*), United Ukrainian Ballet (*Giselle*), the Vaganova Academy of Russian Ballet (*Nutcracker* and graduation performances), Ballet Arizona (*Nutcracker*), Opéra de Lausanne (*Eugene Onegin, Candide*), and the Mikhailovsky Theatre (*Die Zauberflöte*).

Heine has performed in some of the world's most important theaters and concert venues, including the Royal Opera House, Opéra de Paris Bastille, the Festspielhaus Baden-Baden, the Bolshoi Theater, Teatro Regio Torino, Bunka Kaikan and many more. He has guest conducted the Sinfonieorchester Basel, Orchestra della Svizzera Italiana, La Verdi Orchestra of Milan, the Orchestra Filarmonica del Teatro Comunale di Bologna, Orchestra Teatro Regio Torino, the Orchestra of the Royal Opera House, Orchestre de Chambre de Lausanne, the Kennedy Center Opera House Orchestra, and many others.

Upcoming performances include a new production of *Candide* at the Northern Lights Music Festival, and a debut at Norwegian National Ballet (*Jewels*).



# Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky / Composer

Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky (May 7, 1840 - November 6, 1893), was a Russian composer of the Romantic era. He began his musical education at age 5 with piano lessons. Even though music had always fascinated him, law was selected as a career path. He did not make his passion of music a livelihood until later in life. At 19, Tchaikovsky graduated with the rank of titular counselor, a low rung on the civil service ladder. Three years later, Tchaikovsky changed career paths to pursue his passion of music. He enrolled at

the Saint Petersburg Conservatory where he flourished in his studies. His first public showing was a work titled "Characteristic Dances" on September 11, 1865. He later composed the ballet *Swan Lake* from 1875-1876. This ballet, initially done in four acts, was based upon Russian folk tales. Tchaikovsky received 800 rubles for payment which was considered a small fortune in his day. 800 rubles is about 23 dollars in today's world. The original premiere of *Swan Lake* was not well received. The critics of that time claimed that the music was too complex to be a ballet piece. History has overruled their criticisms as *Swan Lake* is now thought to be one of Tchaikovsky's most valuable and memorable pieces.

(1875-1876): *Swan Lake*, Op. 20. Tchaikovsky's first ballet and was first performed (with some omissions) at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow in 1877.

(1888-1889): *The Sleeping Beauty*, Op. 66. Tchaikovsky considered this work one of his best. Its first performance was in 1890 at the Mariinsky Theatre in Saint Petersburg, Russia.

(1891-1892): *The Nutcracker*, Op. 71. Tchaikovsky himself was less satisfied with this, his last ballet. It was only in his last years, with his last two ballets, that his contemporaries came to really appreciate his qualities as a ballet music composer.

# CHARLOTTE BALLET DANCERS



Isaac Aoki / Utah

Originally from Salt Lake City, Utah, Isaac Aoki made his debut at three as a frog in *Thumbelina* at the University of Utah. He does not remember a time he didn't love dance. He went on to study at Ballet West Academy, performing yearly in its *Nutcracker*. He then earned a full scholarship to the Kirov Academy in Washington DC where he studied Russian Vaganova technique. # **Daniil Simkin /** Germany

Daniil Simkin was born in Novosibirsk, Russia, in 1987, the son of acclaimed ballet dancers Dmitrij Simkin and Olga Aleksandrova. His family moved to Western Europe in 1990 and took residence in Wiesbaden, Germany, where Daniil grew up.

At the age of nine, Daniil began ten years of daily ballet training with his mother. In these training years, he won several important ballet awards, including the Senior Gold Medal at the Jackson International Ballet competition in 2006, the Grand Prix at the Helsinki

International Ballet Competition in 2005 and the Gold Medal at the International Ballet Competition in Varna in 2004. After graduating academic high school in Germany, Daniil joined the Vienna State Opera Ballet as a demi-soloist in 2006 and began his career as a guest performer around the world. In 2008, he joined American Ballet Theatre as a soloist and was subsequently promoted to principal dancer in 2012. He since then has danced most major classical and neoclassical roles in the company's repertoire. In his professional career, Daniil has performed throughout North and South America, Asia, and the Middle East.

In 2015, together with the Joyce Theater in New York, Daniil spearheaded and produced an evening of contemporary original choreography called "INTENSIO," which toured the United States and internationally. This was followed in 2017 by a production of a multidisciplinary dance installation at the Guggenheim Museum in New York which involved generative video projections and costumes by Dior. Beginning with the 2018-2019 season Daniil joined Staatsballett Berlin as a principal and maintained his position at ABT, performing with both companies as often as his schedule allows. In 2021, Simkin founded the production company Studio Simkin to explore and develop dance opportunities for the next era with the highest production value and artistic standard, encouraging ballet to evolve within a digital environment and for new forums.



# **Angelica Generosa /** New Jersey

Angelica Generosa is from South River, New Jersey. She studied on scholarship at the School of American Ballet and Princeton Ballet, and she attended summer courses at the School of American Ballet, Chautauqua Summer Program, and New Jersey Ballet. She also studied with Gina Forcella in Sayreville, New Jersey. In 2011, Ms. Generosa joined Pacific Northwest Ballet as an apprentice. Some of the leading roles she has performed include the principal role in George Balanchine's Theme and Variations, Princess Aurora in Ronald Hyde's The Sleeping Beauty, Odette/Odile in Kent Stowell's Swan Lake, Peter Boal and Doug Fullington's production of Giselle, William Forsythe's The Vertiginous Thrill of Exactitude, Emergence by Crystal Pite, Tarantella, Rubies, and Justin Peck's Year of the Rabbit. She has also worked with many Choreographers including Alexei Ratmansky, Dwight Rhoden, Crystal Pite, Annabelle Ochoa, Edwaard Liang and Alejandro Cerrudo to name a few.
